A groundbreaking milestone in inclusive education and practical training through the IP4J project.

Inercia Digital in Malaga participates in the Erasmus+ programme with its Innovative and Practical training for low-skilled and migrants Jobs (IP4J) project.

The main objective of the IP4J project is to address gaps in access to and participation in formal and non-formal education, especially for immigrants and low-skilled workers. Through the development of tools and methodologies based on web 2.0 and OER, it seeks to reduce existing gaps in vocational training and improve employment opportunities for these groups. The project materials and resources focus on areas such as gardening, cleaning, cooking, crafts and artistic products, addressing real needs and essential services. The IP4J project held a multiplier event organized by Inercia Digital on May 19, 2023 at the FANTEC conference, located at the UMA School of Industrial Engineering in Malaga. This event provided a platform for stakeholders from different countries to learn in detail about the project, its objectives and results.

During the event, the IP4J project was fully presented: its objectives, the context in which it arose and a



detailed presentation of the activities and achievements. The second part of the event session was focused on the IP4J mobile application so that the participants had the opportunity to get to know it first hand, to experience for themselves its innovative functionalities. The presentation of this mobile application, developed for Android devices and introducing a novel approach to work-based learning, as well as of the project in general was well received and aroused the interest of the participants, who positively







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valued the project's contribution to education and training. The successful event was attended by 45 participants from different organizations and cities, who had the opportunity to exchange knowledge, experiences and best practices related to practical training and educational inclusion. As representatives of the project, Inercia Digital ensured that all participants received the necessary information and resources to understand and make the most of the IP4J project.

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In addition, in 2021 it has achieved the <u>Erasmus+ Accreditation for Vocational Education and Training</u> which aims to strengthen the European dimension of teaching and learning, improve the quality of teaching and learning, foster common European values, promoting knowledge of the shared European heritage and the richness of diversity, and contribute to the creation of the European Education Area.
